The realization of the existence of non-violable laws of nature in social science will advance society into the Age of Social Science from the Age of Science, which started with the recognition of the existence of non-violable laws of nature in science.

Capitalism believes in competition, which increases wealth, but decreases value, for wealth in the hands of the poor is worth more than that in the hands of the rich. Communism believes in sharing, which increases value, but decreases wealth, for the incentive to work hard decreases.
